- 2 pieces of 8 1/2 x 11-inch white construction paper
- Crayola® Crayons
- "Wash" (water, Crayola® tempera paint)
- Scissors
- Crayola® No Run School Glue
- Craft Smart® Paint Brush
- Creatology™ Pom Poms, 2 medium yellow
- Creatology™ chenille stem, orange
- Creatology™ Wiggle Eyes, 2 small

## Colorful 3-D Spring Cards

### Step 1

Cut two large ovals from construction paper. Have the students press down hard with crayons to color oval to represent an egg.

### Step 2

Paint the egg with a "wash." Wash is one cup water mixed with one tablespoon tempera paint.

### Step 3

After eggs dry, have the students poke a hole in the center of the egg, cut four or five slits away from the hole and bend the slits back.

### Step 4

Have the students glue the remaining oval along the edge behind the colored egg.

### Step 5

Make the chick by gluing 2 pom poms together. Cut 1" pieces of the chenille stem and twist together to create legs. Glue to the body. Add wiggle eyes. Glue the finished fuzzy yellow chick inside the window created by the flaps.

### Craft Notes

Adult supervision is required at all times.

### Tip

Write a message inside the egg. Glue a picture of each student inside the egg. Students make their own chicks with yellow pom poms.
